Read Colossians 3:12-15 and discuss how this can applied?

Read and discuss the following quote:

Oh, the comfort, the inexpressible comfort of feeling safe with a person, having neither to weigh thoughts nor measure words, but pour them all out just as they are, chaff and grain together, knowing that a faithful hand will take and sift them, keep what is worth keeping, and then with the breath of kindness blow the rest away. -George Eliot.

What are some of the ways you have contributed to these things? How did that make you feel?

In Hebrews 10:24 the word "Spur" is used:

Hebrews 10

24 And let us consider how we may "spur" one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another

How do we try to encourage and motivate our friends in a "very strong manner" without endangering the friendship?

How should we respond when our Christian friends are making choices that we know are not in their best interests without loosing the friendship?
