Going Deeper

“Happy marriages are not marriages without obstacles; they are marriages where couples use obstacles as opportunities to grow in their partnership.” As you work through these Small Group questions take it as an opportunity to strengthen your relationships.

A good marriage can be achieved by putting your spouses needs ahead of your own, but a great marriage can be achieved, first, by putting Jesus at the center of it, and then putting our spouses needs ahead of our own.

There were 4 main points that were discussed in the message.

1. Don't fix my problems

Robert Leahy in the Huffington Post writes... “men think that the purpose of communicating is to solve a problem, and that venting your feelings is not productive.

For many women, what is just as important to finding a solution is being understood and heard. This means discussing the situation with their partner so that both understand what is going on. In

short, their priority is not just about the end result, but also about the process. When that process is interrupted, they may feel hurt, misunderstood, or unheard."

3. Thank me for what I do

[Romans 12:10](#) "Love each other with genuine affection and take delight in honoring each other"

4. Be trustworthy

[Exodus 20:14](#) talks about being faithful to your spouse in the marriage bed.

What are ways that couples can foster a relationship on trust?
