Daniel 4 is a case study of how pride comes before a fall. Take a moment to read the Spark Notes version of the story.

- Nebuchadnezzar had a dream he was a tree that troubled him.
- Neb called Daniel to interpret it.
- Daniel told Neb that the tree represented him in his pride. This great tree would be cut down and made into a stump unless he humbled himself.
- Neb had a year to humble himself but didn't so God gave him the mind of an animal. For 7 years Neb lived outside and roamed about like an animal until his mind was restored.

Read [Daniel 4:4,5](#) and [Daniel 4:29,30](#). What are the danger signs of pride that you read from the story of Nebuchadnezzar?

[Daniel 4:34-37](#) gives us some insight to what Nebuchadnezzar learned from his experience. Read these verses and make a note of what these words tell us about pride and humility, our role and God's role.

Nebuchadnezzar's speech teaches us **Three steps towards humility**

1. Give credit to God for the good in your life.
2. Don't base your value on your accomplishments.
3. Know that God can do things with your life that you cannot.
