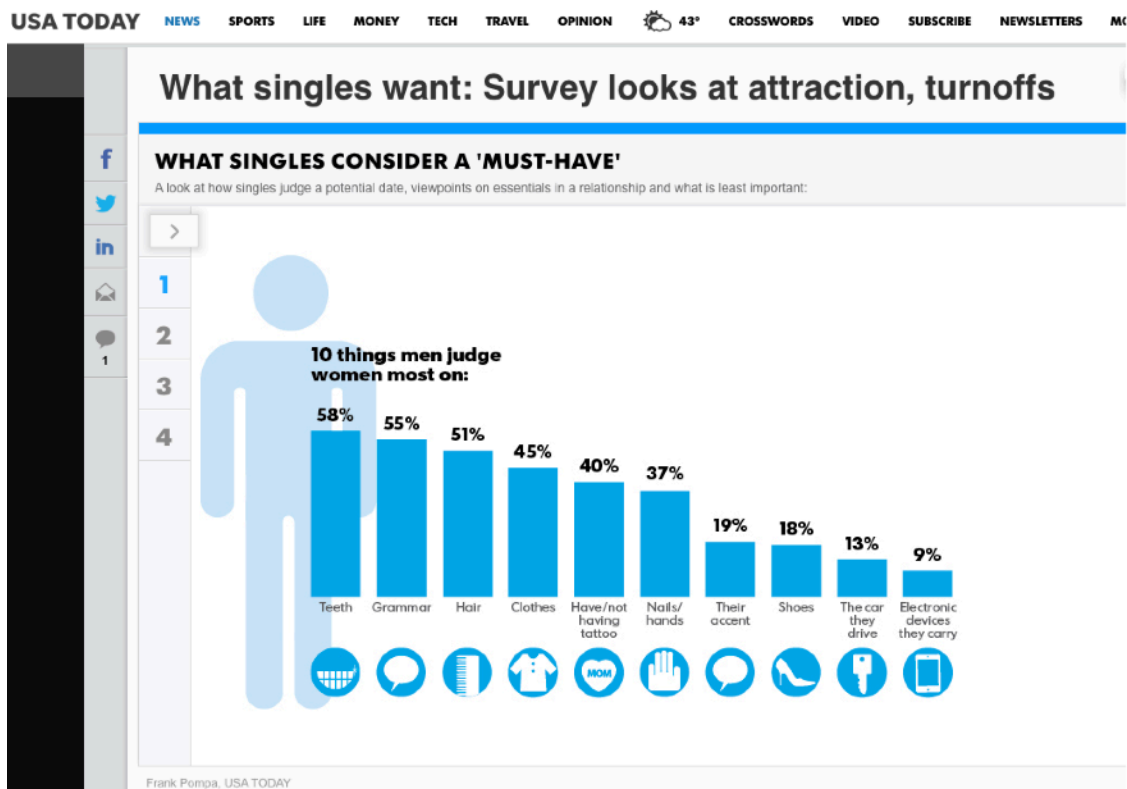
“The number one character quality in relationships”

- ◆ What is the one quality you value most now in your relationships?

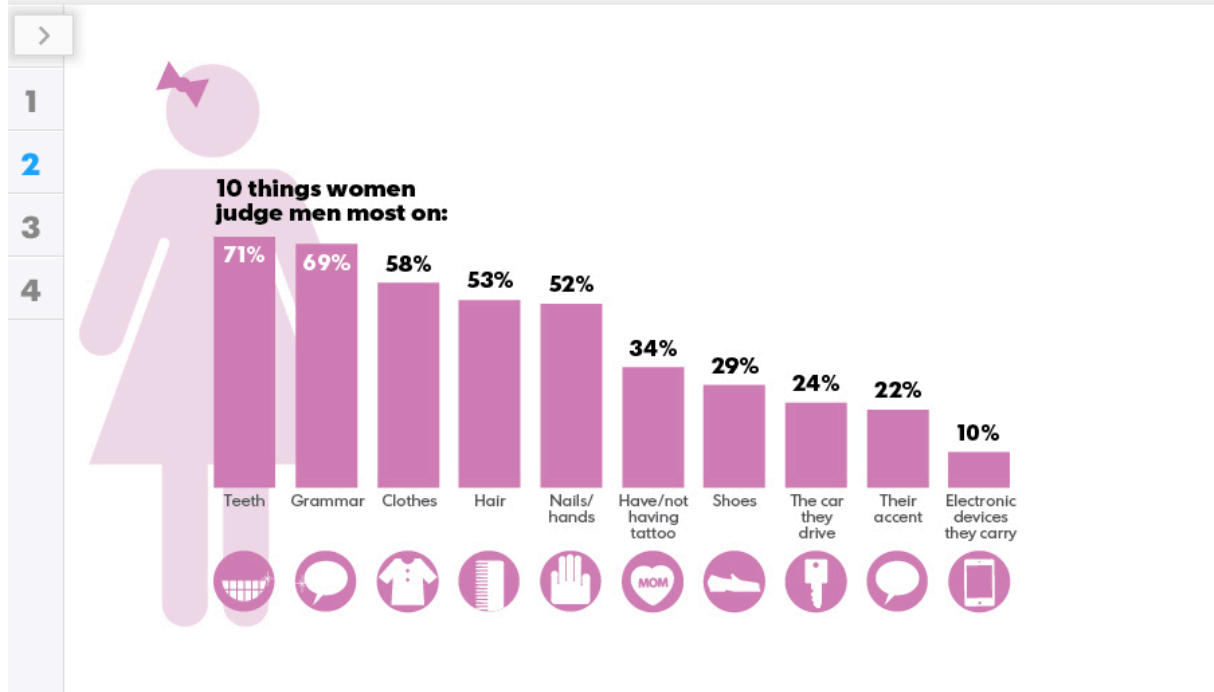
Going Deeper
