Leader Guide

Use this guide to help your students start to think about the message. Don't feel like you have to get them to the right answers every time. Allow students to process and think for themselves. Don't feel like you have to read every question listed here—take into account the environment of your small group and choose ones from each section that you think would help them process the message the best.

Icebreakers

- 1.Name some team rivalries relevant to your OASIS students then ask, “Which side would you sit on?”
- 2.What are some things that are kind of “all or nothing” decisions?
- 3.What one thing from the message stuck out to you the most?

Discussion Questions

- 1.Does Jesus have the throne of your heart or just a couch?
- 2.What other things do people add to their relationship with Christ?
- 3.What are some parts of our lives people like to keep separate from their relationship with Christ?
- 4.What do you think about The speaker saying that following Jesus is like choosing sides? Do you think about your relationship with Jesus like you've chosen His side?
- 5.How do you feel about the verse about hating your family? What does it say to you? (See Luke 14:25-27)
- 6.What do you think making a decision to follow Christ usually means to people? What do you think about having to give all of your life to Him?
- 7.What does baptism mean? Why would someone who had chosen to follow Jesus get baptized?
- 8.If it's all or nothing, what is your decision? Are you ready to go all in with Jesus? What would you choose Jesus over?

Group Challenge

Challenge your group to reflect on what it means to become a fully devoted follower of Christ. Are they willing to choose sides and put their relationship with Jesus above all other parts of their life? Ask them to come back next week with a list of the things in their life that they are willing to choose Jesus over.
